We will explore in the seminar the way to interpret the “dwelling of the others”, the way our fellow citizens “stay” *in* the place and they “make things” *with* the place. We will discuss the different scales in which this can be understood, and the epistemological and political and ethical issues that this confronts who desire to make this understanding relevant to transform personal representation, institutional policies, and large-scale politics. Dwelling is not more just an object of the planning disciplines or “difference” discipline, but it becomes the subject from where understand place and forms of life. It is a common ground from where, with the contribution of different disciplines, sights, and persons (even not expert), look at and try to think places, forms of life, visions of future and actions.
